

We Have Always Known

- We exercise our Inherent Rights to Education
- These are affirmed and protected in the Royal Proclamation, s. 32 Constitution and s. 25 of the Human Rights Charter
- These rights are inherent to our peoples, given by Creation
- We have survived, not without terrible scars
- We are looking toward the future, and healing



A Promise was Made

- The Treaties were made with the Crown, not Canada
- Canada, not INAC, has a responsibility to uphold and honour the treaties
- The promise for education to learn "the cunning of the white man" in order to "live and prosper and provide"*
- Our ancestors saw the treaties as living documents, as long as the sun shines, the grass grows, and the rivers run
